Africans in Diaspora for citizenship on the continent

Africans in Diaspora for citizenship on the continent

Africans in the Diaspora are pushing the agenda for African head of states and the continent folks to acknowledge them dual citizenship.

Through the International Multiracial Shared Cultural Organization (IMSCO), a United Nations NGO specialized in the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) Diasporas launched a drive for co-managing Africa's wealth, development and political clout.

To speed the process, last month IMSCO sent letters directly to the people, Head of States and Prime Ministers of Africa requesting each state to officially acknowledge dual citizenship to any African American (AA) and African in the Diaspora who requests it.

The African American dual citizenship enactment will offer an immense amount of opportunities for Africans to help develop each other and prosper," they say in a press release sent to the Sunday Citizen recently.

"To change and advance, Africans must focus on education and linking the youth to African development projects as a way to earn money and rebuild their broken communities.

Linking with Africans in America will empower all concerned including non-African people."

They note that African American dual citizenship interaction will enable African people as well as states to rewrite all Bilateral Trade agreements and end economic apartheid.

Meaning Africans will have the political and economic clout to rewrite or overwrite any treaty or contract in order to help protect Africa from any unwanted product dumping, political sabotage, etc.

Dual citizenship will offer true democracy if that's the peoples' choice.

"Dual citizenship will offer an immense amount of opportunities to the entire African family. African Americans need African Passports not tourist visa," according to a release.

They said Dual citizenship will enable AA to reverse the African brain drain and will enable AA to enlist in the African Union arm forces to end conflicts.

It will also enable African American to build advanced universities to grow state of the art health, agricultural, technologies, finance and manufacturing institutions.
